#### **All - A Scout is Helpful**

Leader - A stranger is a new friend that I haven't met before. A friend seeks to understand other people, and respects their right to be different in their ideas, customs, race, and religion. Even when we choose to disagree, we should always remain friends.

#### **All - A Scout is Friendly**

Leader - Being polite to everyone regardless of their age or position is the mark of a person with manners. Good manners make it easier for people to get along. When a person does thoughtful acts and has a kindly respect for everyone, he shows others that he has respect for himself.

#### **All - A Scout is Courteous**

Leader - The Golden Rule tell us that we should treat other people as we want to be treated. Jesus has taught us that there is a tremendous strength in being gentle. We should never harm or kill anything without reason.

#### **All - A Scout is Kind**
